
Being old examples from Kaohsiung, Southern Taiwan

I have to find the right balance

between paying for the education of my children and paying the living expenses of my parents.... almost not possible for a working class man and not easy for a lower middle class man like me!





I solved the balance problem.....

finally, we took my parents into our flat. We do not have to pay their rent anymore and they can take care about our two little children and our household, when my wife and me are at work.
My parents are happy, that they can help us and that we all are together.
Once a week, we all have a meal in a restaurant and a walk in a park or we do a day trip to a nearby sightseeing spot.

But what, if you are old and alone?



l am 72 and still healthy. Today, I am off and have a walk in these lily fields. I work as a doorkeeper, 12 hour shifts, very low income, but it helps me to survive. Anyway, I meet people and can talk to them! So, I do not feel lonely! However, I am very afraid of becoming sick, cause there is nobody to take care of me!



That's Mr. Chen. He is almost 80 years old. He has also no family. Some of the neighbors talk to him, some do not like him, because he collects garbage: paper, plastic, tin cans, etc. and sells it for a very little money. He is not doing it for the money, he is doing it out of pure boredom. Mr. Chen has a little monthly pension from the government, because he worked as a soldier. Therefore, he does not depend to much on the money of the garbage collecting in contrast to other old folks, who look through garbage out of survival and you make them out easily by their appearance.
